SUBJET: ISSUANCE OF SEAFARER'S IDENTIFICATION AND RECORD BOOK (SIRB)

1. Purpose

- 1.1. The purpose of this Circular is to inform all parties concerned that this Administration, as from 01 January 2024, will require issuance of a Seafarer's Identification and Record Book (SIRB) to all seafarers on board Comorian Flagged vessels, of any nationality;
- 1.2. The SIRB is a seafarer's identity document issued in order to provide the holder with identity papers for travel to or from an assigned vessel and also provides a continuous record of his/her sea service, that contains the Training Certificates, which specify his/hers qualifications.

2. Application

- 2.1. As of 01 January 2024, it is mandatory for all seafarers, whether they are on the Minimum Safe Manning Certificate or not, to hold a SIRB, also commonly known as a Discharge Book or Seaman's book that has been issued by the National Agency of Maritime Affairs of the Union of Comoros (ANAM) to record their training and sea service;
- 2.2. Masters, Officers and Ratings who intend to serve on-board any ship flying the flag of Comoros on or after 01 January 2024 shall apply for a SIRB not later than 31 December 2023;
- 2.3. Masters, Officers and Ratings who begun serving on-board any ship flying the flag of Comoros prior 31 December 2023 shall apply for a SIRB not later than 29 February 2024, following the implementation period of this circular.

3. General

- 3.1. A Comorian SIRB is not an international identity document;
- 3.2. Every SIRB is valid for five (5) years. When an SIRB expires, the sea service pages remain valid; therefore, the seafarer should retain possession of all expired SIRBs.

4. Procedure for SIRB Application

- 4.1. Each application for SIRB should be submitted by the Owners/Managers to the correspondent Deputy Commissioner or ANAM's Head Office;
- 4.2. Each application for SIRB should be accompanied by clear scanned copies of the following documentation:
 - Completed Application Form;
 - Valid Medical Fitness certificate;
 - Colored passport size photo;
 - Valid national ID¹ or Passport;
 - Valid Certificate of Competency (COC) where applicable;
 - Valid Certificate of Proficiency (COP) of Watch-keeping where applicable;
 - Employment Letter by the owning/managing company for capacities that do not require COC or COP;
 - Valid Basic Safety certificates in accordance with STCW, as amended, Regulation VI/1;
 - Valid Ship Security related certificate in accordance with STCW, as amended, Regulation VI/5 or VI/6.
 - Valid COPs in accordance with STCW, as amended, requirements, depending on the type of vessel (Tankers, RO-RO Passengers and Passengers) – where applicable.
